#### Message from The Rural Dean

#### **Dear Parishioners**

By now, many of you will know that the Rev'd Jaqueline Mould took the difficult decision—for personal reasons—to resign as Minister-in-Charge of Greenisland, after a few brief months. I encourage you to remember Jacqueline and her family in your prayers.

Having lived with the social effects of Coronavirus for much of this year, you don't need me to tell you how much life has changed since March. What I will say, however, is that we aren't out of the woods yet. Other countries and certain areas of the UK have gone back into lockdown, and we must prepare ourselves for the possibility that the same could happen to us in the coming months—maybe even in the coming weeks. Nevertheless, we are trying to return to some sense of normality. Within the Church, the most obvious sign of this will be the re-commencement of Sunday services. It is really important, however, that we all understand that we are not picking up where we left off when the church closed six months ago. Both the NI Executive and the Church of Ireland have set in place rules governing services of worship, and these will have a significant impact on your experience of going to church. The new arrangements have been listed elsewhere in this magazine.

Having re-opened my own church (St Peter's on the Antrim Road) in July, I know from experience that there will undoubtedly be a little teething trouble. After years of coming to church and going through a familiar routine, it will be strange to be presented with rules about what you can and cannot do. Some of those rules might not make much sense, and you might simply disagree with others. But, regardless of how we feel about them, we are all obliged to follow them. Only by doing so, will the church continue to open Sunday by Sunday. So I implore you to follow the rules, and any instructions from the clergy and churchwardens. Let our focus be not on *how* we worship, but rather—as always should be the case—on *who* we worship.

#### **Arrangements For Opening Church During COVID19**

The Rural Dean and Select Vestry have made the decision to re-open the Church of the Holy Name for worship on Sunday 6th September. It will be wonderful to praise God together again, but please note and follow these rules if you intend to come to church:

- The service will begin as normal at 10:30am, and last forty minutes.
- Please use hand sanitiser when you enter the building. You must, if possible, wear a face mask. If you wish to wear gloves, please wear a fresh pair that have not been worn elsewhere.
- For the purposes of contact tracing if someone falls ill, your name and telephone number will be recorded each time you come to worship.
- There will be a one-way system: You will enter through the foyer of the halls, and exit through the external door of the church
- The rows of seats have been spaced out further, and a distance of two metres will be maintained between members of different households.
- You will be instructed where to sit by the Churchwardens, filling up from the front of the church
- Instead of a printed order of service, the text of the service will be displayed on the projector screen.
- There will be no congregational singing, but there may be a small choir who will sing one or two hymns.
- Children will remain with their parents throughout the service.
- If there is Holy Communion, you will remain in your seat, rather than moving forward to the communion rails.
- To limit the amount of movement within the church, there will be no FWO collection during the service. Any FWO envelopes or loose money should be deposited before or after the service in the marked box at the back of the church.
- Except in the case of serious emergencies, the toilets will be unavailable as otherwise they would need to be cleaned thoroughly between each person using them.
- At the end of the service, you should remain at your seat until the Churchwardens instructs you to leave.
- Despite our understandable desire to have a chat with those whom we haven't seen for a few months, groups of people will not be permitted to form inside the church building and will be strongly discouraged on church grounds.

#### **Open Door Service**

Due to the Covid19 pandemic and the restrictions in place to control the spread of the virus and try to keep us all safe, the Sunday club and other Kids activities have been temporarily suspended. We hope that this restriction will soon be relaxed but for now kids will have to remain in church throughout the service with their parents.

Prior to the current situation it has been great to see so many of our younger people regularly at church and Sunday Club, you are a blessing! We hope that the current suspension will not dampen your enthusiasm and that those who can will continue to attend church and return to Sunday club when it recommences.

There is no better way to give your child the best start in life than bringing them regularly along to church and encouraging them to be involved in our kids activities.

#### REFRESHMENTS AFTER FUNERAL SERVICES

Covid19 restrictions mean that we are not able to offer refreshments after funeral services. This situation may change and if so it will be announced in Church. When making funeral arrangements with the Rural Dean you can check if refreshments are available, if they are and you wish to avail of the service please ask the Rural Dean for details. Typical prices for the refreshment service are:

Sandwiches, shortbread, tea/coffee £5 per head

Soup, sandwiches, shortbread, tea/coffee £7 per head

Sandwiches, sausage rolls, £8 per head cocktail sausages, shortbread,

tea/coffee

You will be asked to give approximate numbers to be catered for, and which of the above menus you require. Should the numbers taking refreshments exceed the numbers given you will be invoiced for the numbers who have received refreshments.
